### **Feast of St Columban**

Monday marks the feast day of one of Ireland's first and greatest missionaries. Born in 543AD, Columban desired to 'go on pilgrimage with Christ'. It was an incredible missionary undertaking that brought him and his twelve companions throughout Europe in treacherous conditions, setting up monasteries and teaching the faith during what has been known as the 'dark ages' following the collapse of the Roman Empire. His greatest monastery was at Bobbio in the north of Italy, where he died in 615AD.

## The words of this powerful hymn are attributed to St Columban

Alone with none but thee, my God, I journey on my way: what need I fear when thou art near, O King of night and day? more safe am I within thy hand than if a host should round me stand.

My life I yield to thy decree, and bow to thy control in peaceful calm, for from thine arm no power can wrest my soul: could earthly omens e'er appal a man that heeds the heavenly call?

The child of God can fear no ill, his chosen, dread no foe; we leave our fate with thee, and wait thy bidding when to go: 'tis not from chance our comfort springs, thou art our trust, O King of kings.

# Getting ready for Confirmation in 2021



Confirmation Enrolment Mass will take place in the parish church next Sunday at 11am; the children will take part in the Mass by pre-recorded readings, prayers and music.

Prior to the Enrolment Mass, the children will take part in a **Ceremony of Light**, indicating that the gift of faith, which began at Baptism, brings us closer to Jesus, who is the light of the world; details of the ceremony of light will be circulated through the schools.

## Revision of the Opening Prayer in the celebration of Mass



The opening prayer of the Mass is known as the 'Collect' prayer.

From the First Sunday of Advent (next weekend), the word "one" should be omitted from the end of the Collect prayer. Instead of "one God, for ever and ever" the prayers will now conclude with the formula "God, for ever and ever."

The word "one" has appeared in the English version of the Roman Missal in both the earlier and the current translations. However, it is not in the Latin original. There is a possibility that this could cause some confusion regarding the identity of the Son within the Blessed Trinity. It could also be misinterpreted to mean that Jesus Christ is just "one God" among others.

### **Remembering Fr Michael Woods PP**

Next Thursday, 26 November, marks the centenary of the death of Fr Michael Woods, Parish Priest of Trim, 1899-1920, who oversaw the completion and opening of the new St Patrick's Parish Church. He was mainly responsible for the decorative features of the church including the themes and designs of the church's principal stained glass windows, those in the sanctuary, the Our Lady of Trim and the St Patrick at Tara windows and the Our Lady of Good Counsel window behind the organ, negotiating with the stained glass companies, Mayer of Munich and Hardman of Birmingham. In one letter he asked Hardman for an "estimate for the very best and richest glass you can make" and in another stated "I want the very best article that can be produced at the lowest price at which I can get it".

Michael Woods was born in Clonmellon, Co. Westmeath and studied in the diocesan seminary, which was then in Navan, and in Maynooth where he was ordained priest in 1873. He then returned to a professorship in the seminary in Navan, and subsequently ministered in Multyfarnham, Slane, Navan (where later on he was Administrator), Rahan, and came to Trim in 1899 in succession to Fr Philip Callary who was moved to Tullamore. Fr Woods had been ill for a number of years before his death in 1920 at the age of 71.

According to his obituary in the local newspaper he was prominent in nationalist agitation: "In the days of the Land League and in the politics of the time Father Woods was a pillar of strength. Against the coercion of the day he fought the fight of the people and pointed to them the way that victory lay, and many now in the County Meath owe their present prosperity to the battles he waged".

Fr Michael Woods is buried in the grounds of St Patrick's Church, Trim and the baptistry in that church commemorates him as do a number of fonts in Boardsmill church.


